

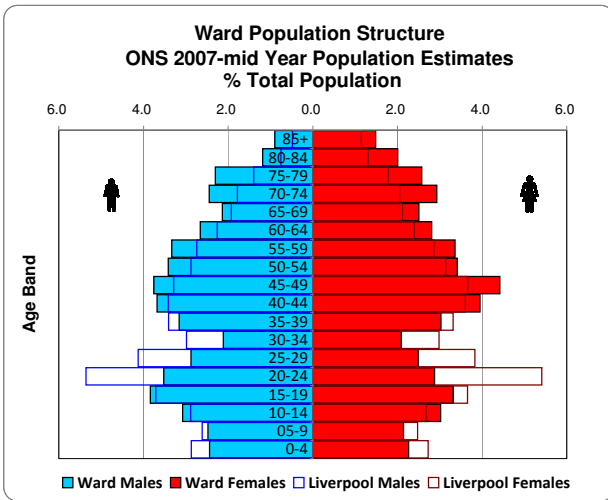
LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

Ward Summary

Allerton & Hunts Cross is amongst the least deprived quintile in Liverpool. 88% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented which is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is amongst the best in Liverpool and, in the case of females, is better than nationally.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is lower than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is above the Liverpool average.

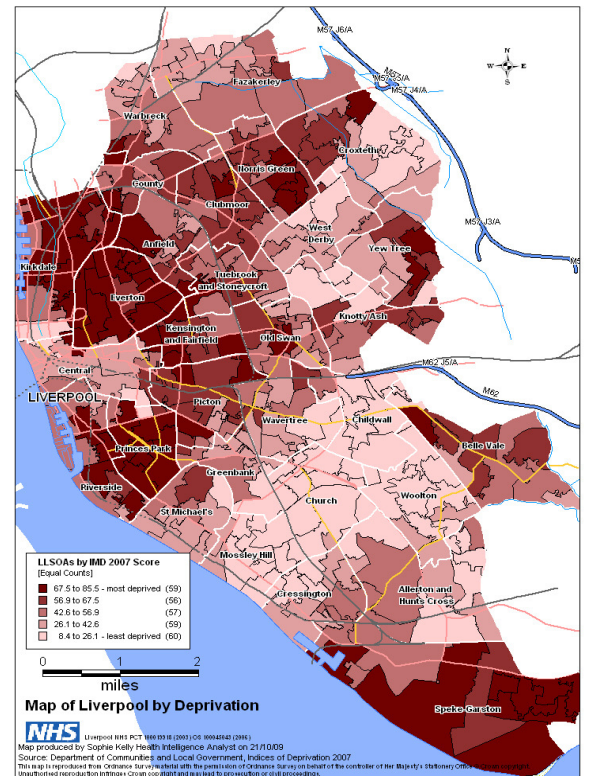
Rates of domestic burglaries and robberies are lower than for Liverpool although rates of vehicle crime are higher.

According to the 2001 Census, more than a fifth of residents have a limiting long term illness which is higher than for Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

Allerton & Hunts Cross is amongst the bottom quintile for male and female all age mortality due to all causes, all circulatory diseases and all cancers. This is also the case for premature mortality.

For males and females of all ages, Allerton & Hunts Cross's mortality rates for coronary heart disease are amongst the lowest in the city whilst stroke mortality is below the Liverpool average.

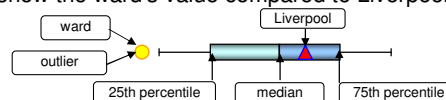
