

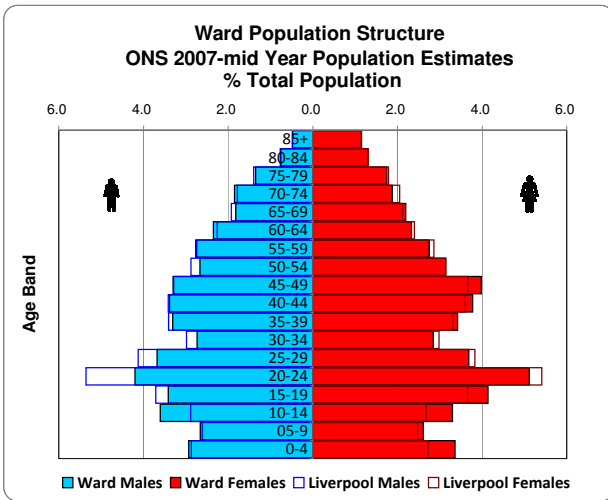
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Anfield is amongst the second most deprived quintile in Liverpool. More than three-quarters of its dwellings are privately owned or rented which is above the average for Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than for Liverpool and, in the case of females, amongst the bottom quintile for Liverpool.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is higher than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A\* - C grades is comparable to the Liverpool average.

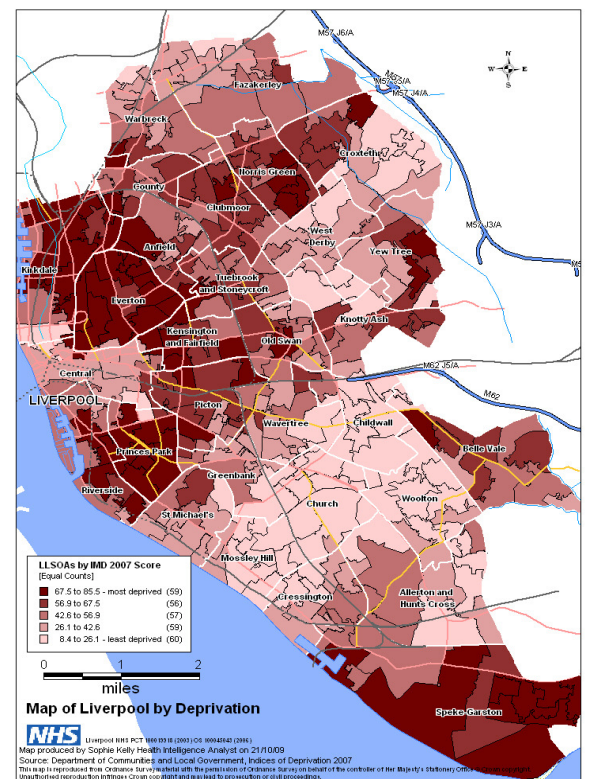
Rates of domestic burglaries and vehicle crime are higher than for Liverpool whilst robberies are comparable to the Liverpool average.

According to the 2001 Census, more than a quarter of residents have a limiting long term illness which is slightly higher than the Liverpool average.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are higher than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

Anfield's all age male and female mortality rates for all causes and all circulatory diseases are higher than the average for the city. This is also the case for premature mortality. Cancer mortality rates tend to be lower than the Liverpool average.

For males and females of all ages, Anfield's mortality rates for coronary heart disease mortality are higher than the Liverpool average whilst its stroke mortality rates are amongst the highest in the city.

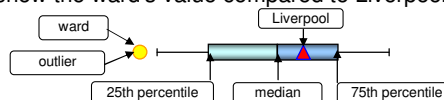
