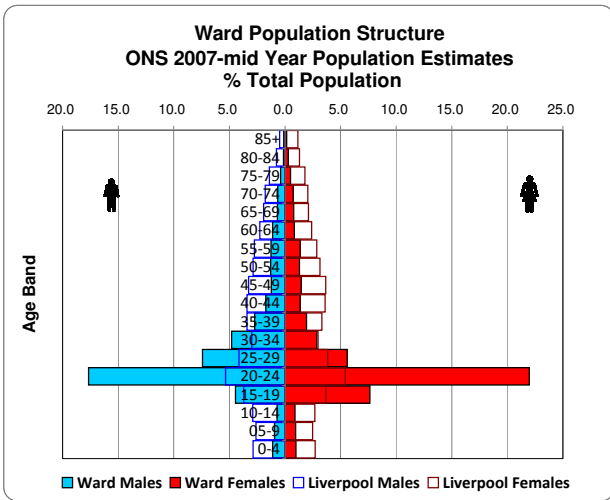


LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

Ward Summary

Central is amongst the third most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 86% of its dwellings are privately rented or owned which is higher than for Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than the Liverpool average. There is a high representation of 20-24 year olds due in part to the city's large student population.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is lower than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A* - C grades is amongst the lowest in the city.

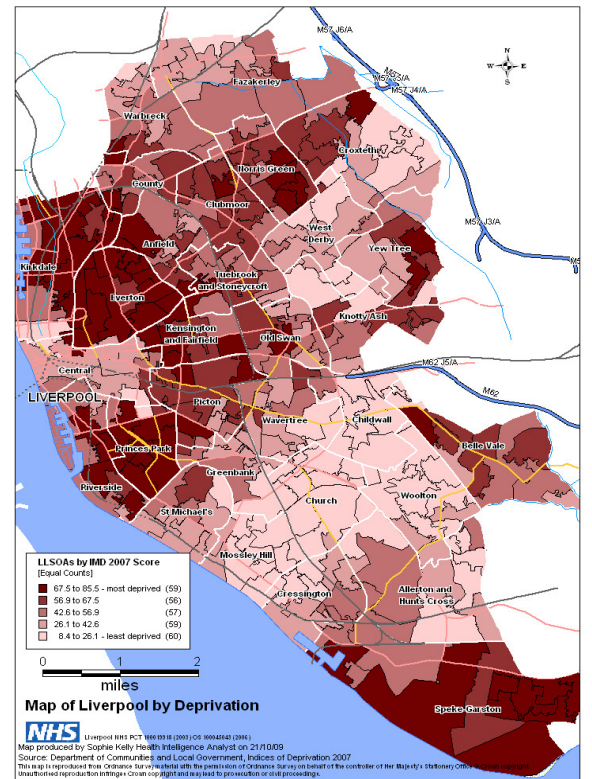
Rates of robberies and vehicle crime are higher than Liverpool although domestic burglary rates are lower.

According to the 2001 Census, 15% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is the lowest in Liverpool.

The percentage of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

For persons of all ages, Central's mortality due to all causes, all circulatory diseases and all cancers is higher than the Liverpool average although male cancer mortality is lower. This is also the case for premature mortality.

For males of all ages, Central's coronary heart disease mortality rate is amongst the highest in the city whilst its all persons all age stroke mortality is comparable to the Liverpool average.

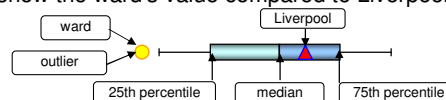
