

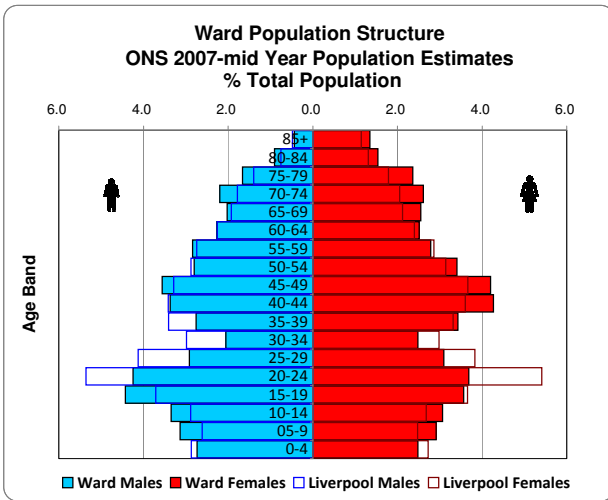
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Clubmoor is amongst the second most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 44% of its dwellings consist of social housing which is above the Liverpool average.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than for Liverpool and nationally.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is higher than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is comparable to the Liverpool average.

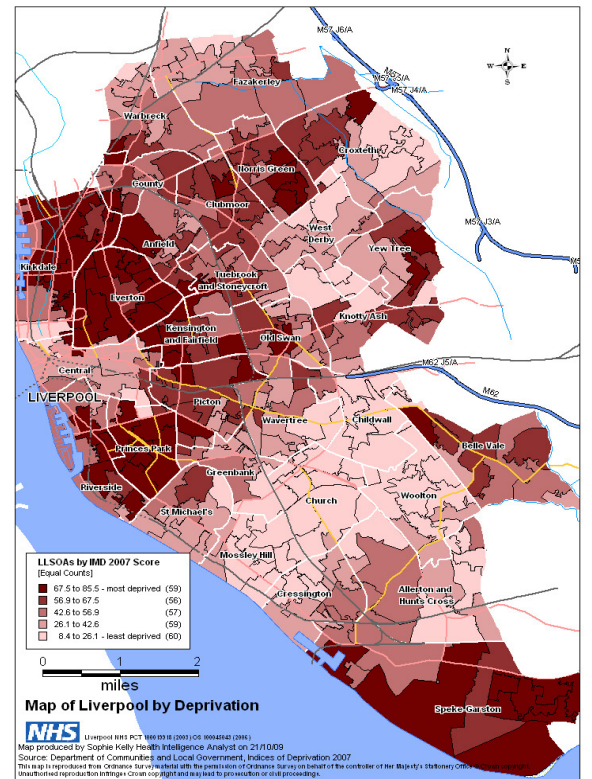
Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are all higher than for Liverpool.

According to the 2001 Census, 30% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are higher than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

Clubmoor's male and female all age mortality rates for all causes and all circulatory diseases are above the Liverpool average, apart from circulatory disease in females. This is also the case for premature mortality. Cancer mortality is amongst the highest in the city.

For males of all ages, Clubmoor has one of the highest stroke mortality rates in the city whilst its mortality from coronary heart disease is higher than the Liverpool average.

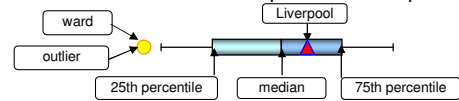
