

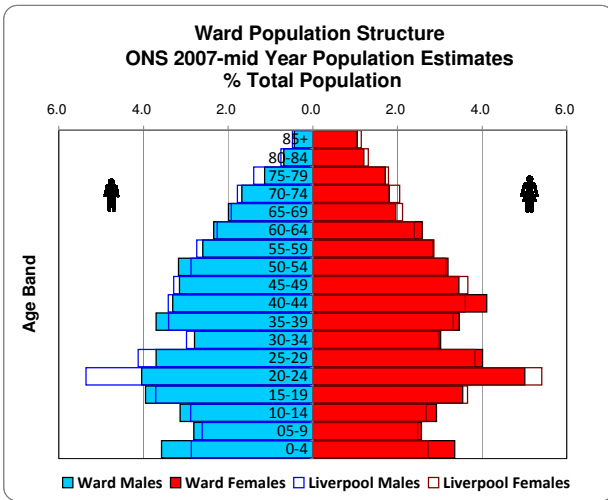
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

County is amongst the second most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 80% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented which is above the Liverpool average.

Life expectancy at birth is comparable to the Liverpool average for females but lower for males.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is the highest in Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is below the Liverpool average.

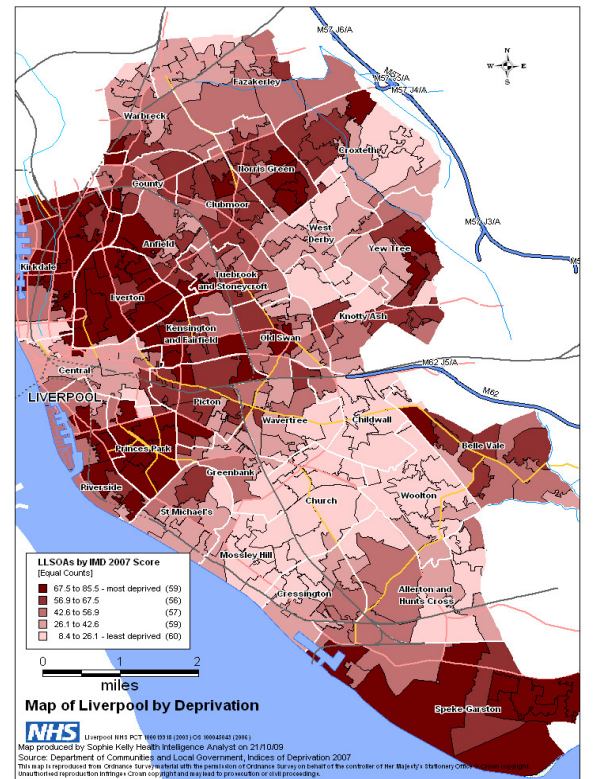
Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are all higher than for Liverpool.

According to the 2001 Census, 25% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is comparable to the Liverpool average.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are higher than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

For persons of all ages, County's mortality rates for all causes and circulatory diseases are above the Liverpool average, this is also the case for premature mortality. Female cancer mortality is also higher than for Liverpool.

For persons of all ages, County has one of the highest rates in the city for coronary heart disease mortality but the lowest for stroke mortality.

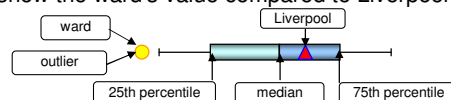
