

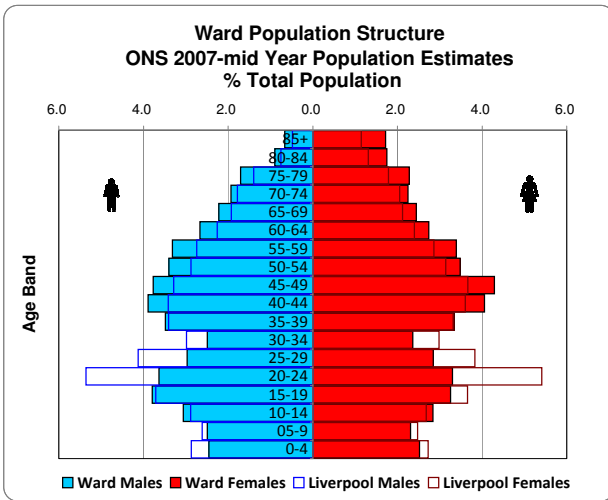
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Cressington is one of the least deprived wards in Liverpool. 83% of its dwellings are privately rented or owned which is higher than for Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is amongst the highest in Liverpool but not better than nationally.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is lower than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is higher than the Liverpool average.

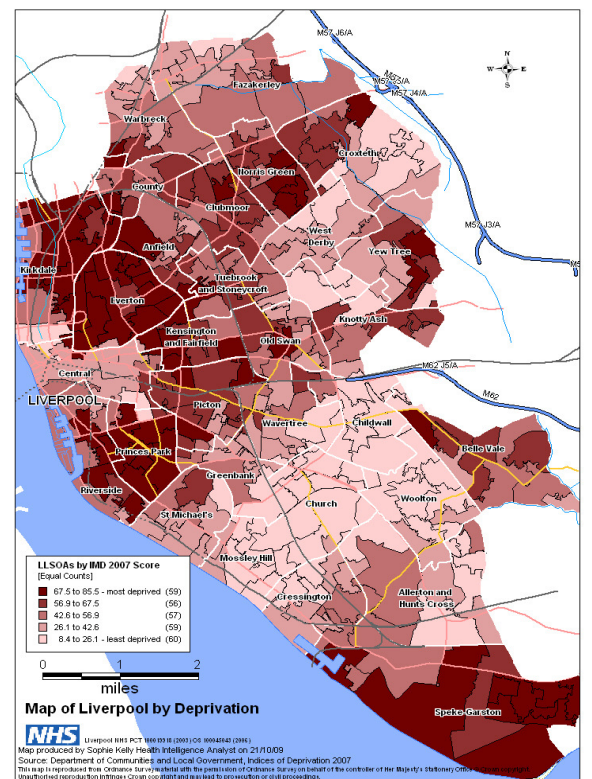
Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are all lower than for Liverpool.

According to the 2001 Census, 23% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is lower than the Liverpool average.

The percentage of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

Cressington's all age, male and female mortality rates for all causes, all circulatory diseases and all cancers are lower than the Liverpool average. This is also the case for premature mortality.

For persons of all ages, Cressington has lower mortality from coronary heart disease and stroke than for Liverpool overall.

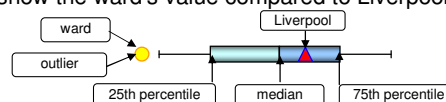
