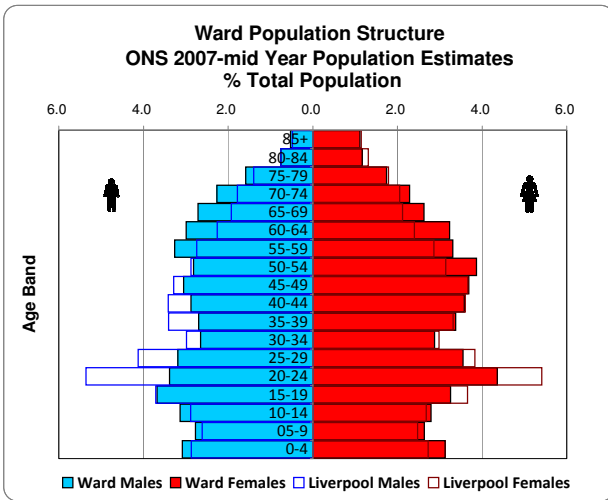


LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

Ward Summary

Everton is amongst the most deprived quintile in Liverpool. More than 60% of its dwellings consist of social housing which is the highest in Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is amongst the lowest in Liverpool.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is lower than the Liverpool average.

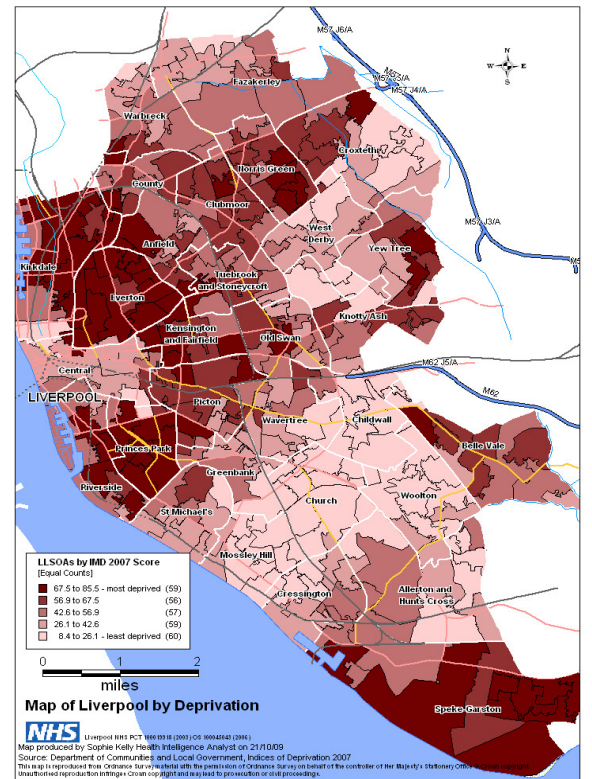
Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are all higher than for Liverpool.

According to the 2001 Census, a third of residents have a limiting long term illness which is the highest in Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are amongst the highest for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

Everton's all age male and female mortality rates for all causes and all cancers are amongst the highest in the city. This is also the case for premature mortality. Circulatory disease mortality is also higher than the Liverpool average.

For persons of all ages, Everton has stroke mortality which is comparable to the Liverpool average whilst its female coronary heart disease mortality is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

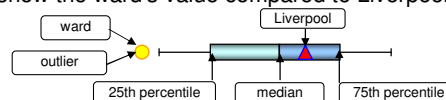
