

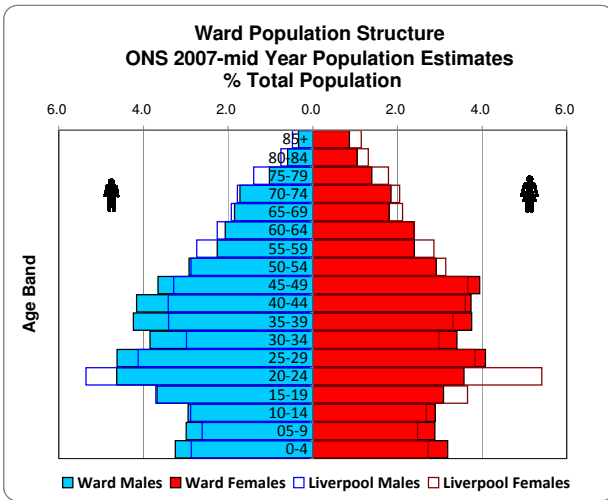

Ward Summary

Fazakerley is amongst the second least deprived quintile in Liverpool. 85% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than nationally but higher than the Liverpool average for males.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is higher than for Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is better than the Liverpool average.

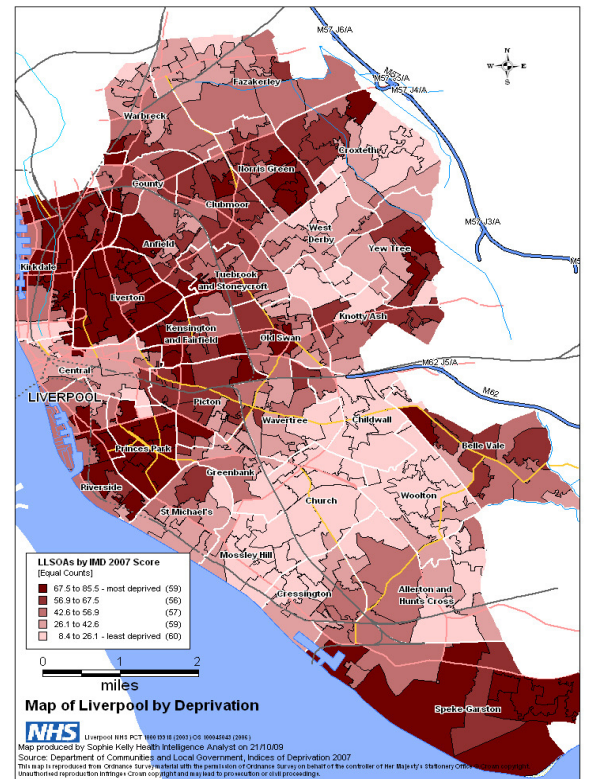
Rates of domestic burglaries and robberies are lower than for Liverpool although rates of vehicle crime are higher.

According to the 2001 Census, 23% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is lower than the Liverpool average.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than for Liverpool as a whole as are rates of worklessness.

Fazakerley's all age mortality rates for females due to all causes and all circulatory diseases is higher than average for the city whilst male mortality is lower. Male and female premature cancer mortality rates are lower than for Liverpool.

For all age mortality from stroke and coronary heart disease female mortality is higher than Liverpool whilst male mortality is lower.

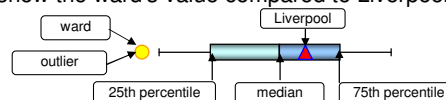
