

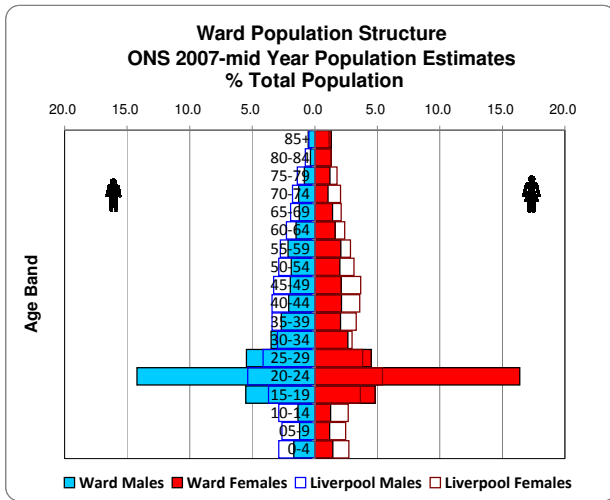

Ward Summary

Greenbank is amongst the second least deprived quintile in Liverpool. 79% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than the Liverpool average.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is amongst the lowest in Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is below the Liverpool average.

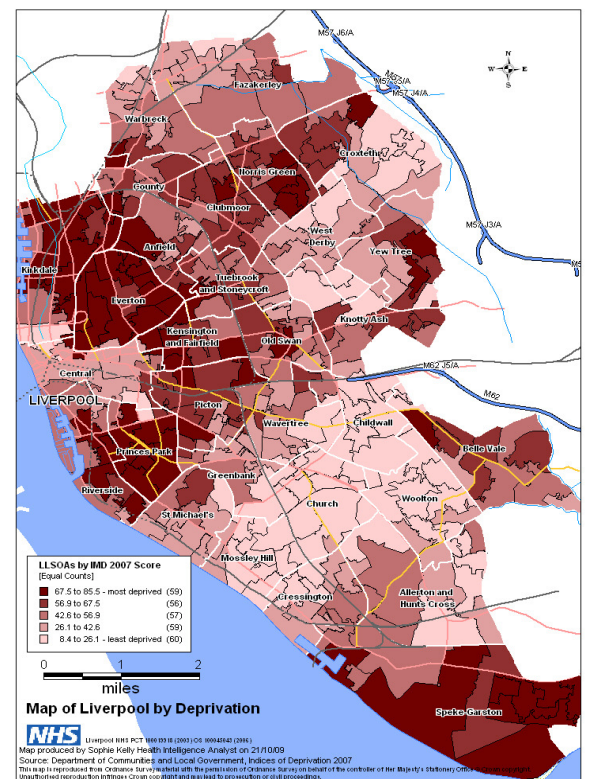
Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are all lower than for Liverpool.

According to the 2001 Census, 19% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is lower than the Liverpool average.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than for Liverpool as a whole as are rates of worklessness.

Greenbank's male and female all age mortality rates for all causes and all circulatory diseases are amongst the highest in the city whilst its cancer mortality is above the Liverpool average. Premature cancer mortality in females is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

For persons of all ages, Greenbank has one of the highest mortality rates in the city for stroke mortality. Coronary heart disease mortality in females of all ages is also amongst the highest.

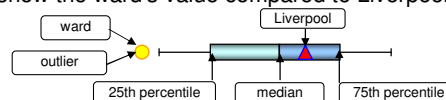
