

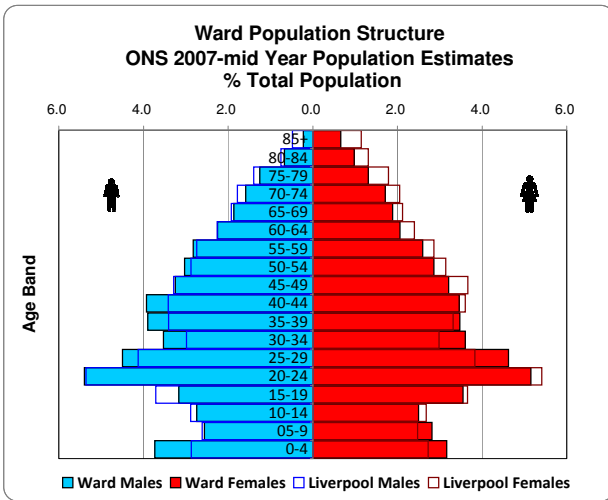
LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

Ward Summary

Kensington & Fairfield is amongst the most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 73% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than nationally but in the case of females, higher than for Liverpool.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is below the Liverpool average.

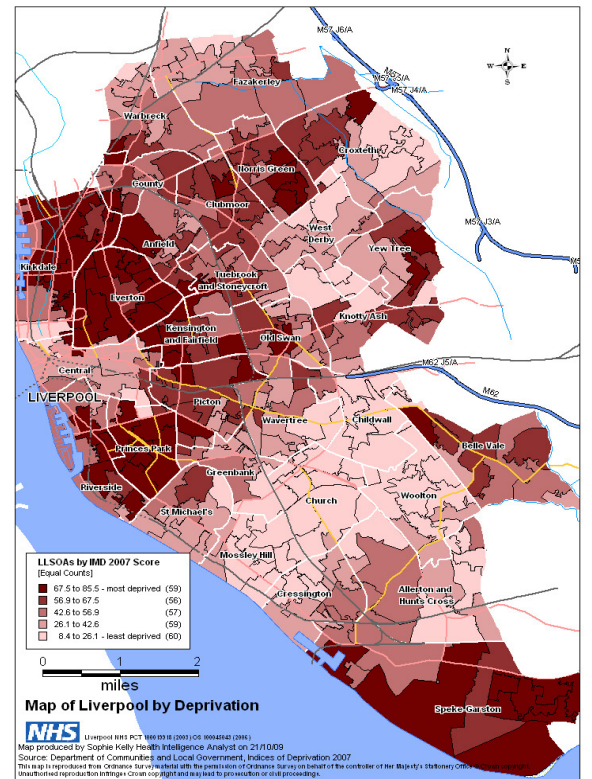
Rates of domestic burglaries and robberies are higher than for Liverpool whilst rates of vehicle crime are lower.

According to the 2001 Census, 28% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are amongst the highest in Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

For persons of all ages, Kensington & Fairfield's mortality rates for all causes and all circulatory diseases are higher than for Liverpool. Circulatory disease mortality for males of all ages is amongst the highest in Liverpool and the same is the case for premature mortality.

Kensington & Fairfield has one of the highest rates in the city for coronary heart disease mortality in males of all ages whilst its stroke mortality rates for persons of all ages are below the Liverpool average.

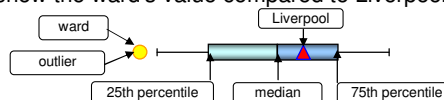
