

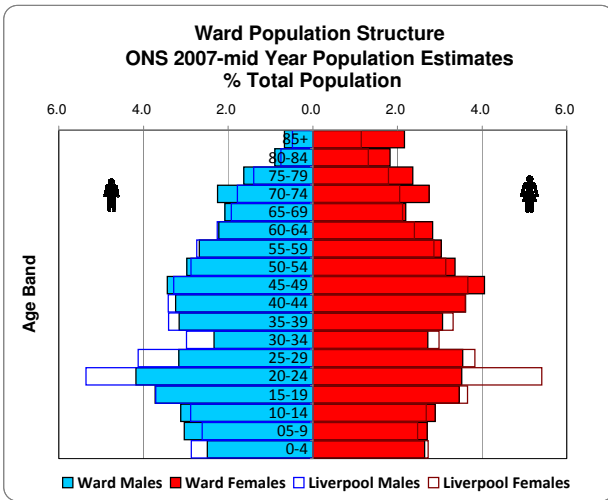
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Knotty Ash is amongst the third most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 30% of its dwellings consist of social housing which is higher than for Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than nationally and the Liverpool average.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is lower than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A\* - C grades is slightly above the Liverpool average.

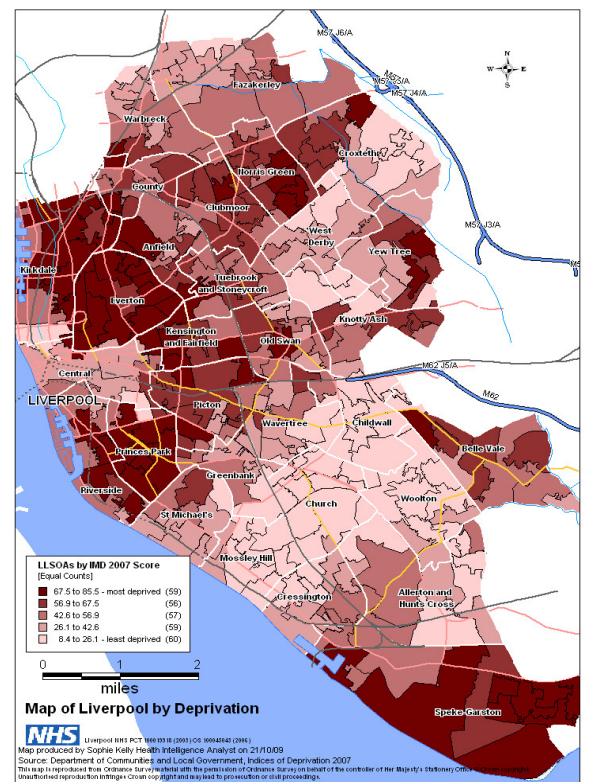
Rates of domestic burglaries are comparable to the Liverpool average whilst rates of robberies and vehicle crime are higher.

According to the 2001 Census, 27% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is higher than for Liverpool.

The proportion of claimants on incapacity benefits is higher than for Liverpool, lower for job seekers allowance, whilst rates of worklessness are comparable to the Liverpool average.

For males and females of all ages, Knotty Ash experiences higher mortality than Liverpool due to all causes and all circulatory diseases. This is also the case for premature mortality. Cancer mortality in males is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

For males and females of all ages, Knotty Ash's mortality rates for coronary heart disease are higher than the Liverpool average whilst stroke mortality rates are amongst the highest.

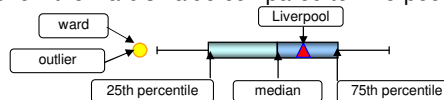
