

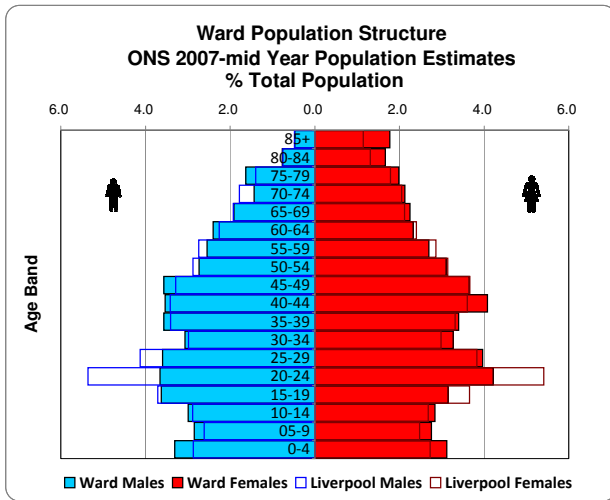
LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

Ward Summary

Old Swan is amongst the third most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 81% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented which is higher than for Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for males is comparative to the Liverpool average but lower for females.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is the higher than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is higher than the Liverpool average.

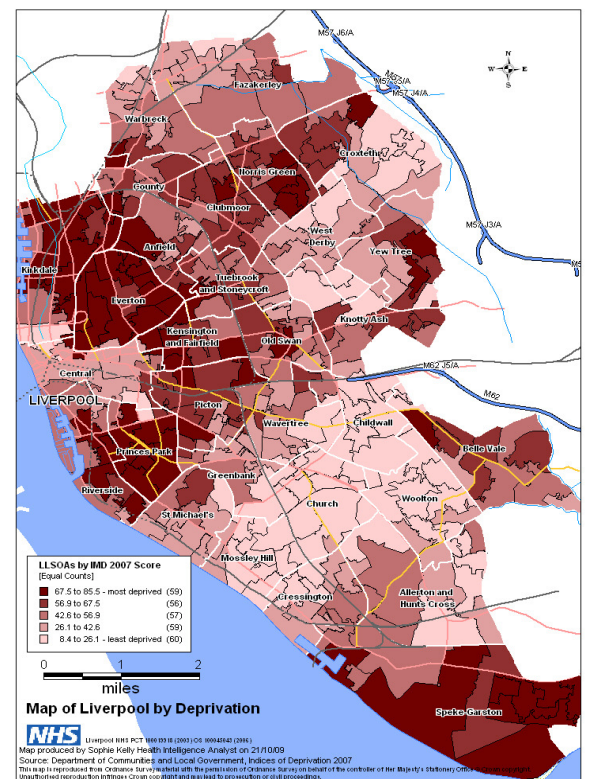
Rates of domestic burglaries and vehicle crime are lower than for Liverpool whilst robberies are higher.

According to the 2001 Census, 25% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is comparable to the average for Liverpool.

The percentage of claimants on incapacity benefits and rates of worklessness are comparable to the Liverpool average, whilst the proportion of job seekers allowance claimants is higher.

For males and females, Old Swan experiences higher all age mortality than Liverpool due to all causes and all circulatory diseases apart from CVD mortality in females. Female cancer mortality is amongst the highest in the city.

For males and females of all ages, Old Swan experiences higher mortality from coronary heart disease than Liverpool whilst its stroke mortality rates are amongst the highest in the city.

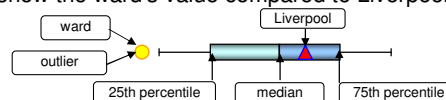
