

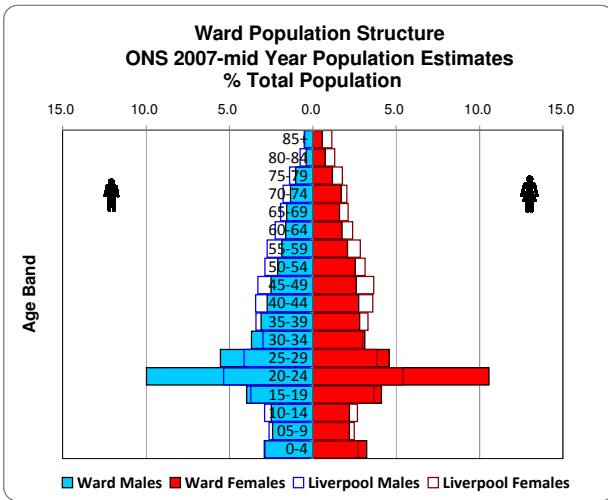

Ward Summary

Picton is amongst the second most deprived quintile in Liverpool. One third of its dwellings consist of social housing.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than the Liverpool average.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is the lower than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A* - C grades is lower than the Liverpool average.

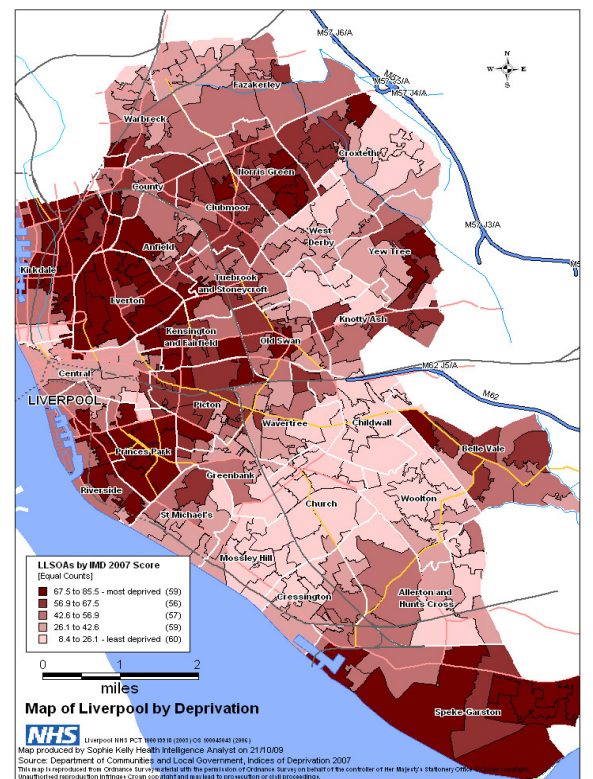
Rates of domestic burglaries and robberies are higher than for Liverpool whilst vehicle crime rates are lower.

According to the 2001 Census, 25% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is comparable to the average for Liverpool.

The percentage of claimants on incapacity benefits is comparable to the Liverpool average, whilst the proportion of job seekers allowance claimants and rates of worklessness are higher.

For males and females, Picton experiences higher all age mortality than Liverpool due to all causes, all circulatory diseases and all cancers. This is also the case for premature mortality with female all cause and male circulatory disease mortality rates the highest in the city.

For males and females of all ages, Picton's mortality rates for coronary heart disease are amongst the highest in the city whilst its stroke mortality is higher than the Liverpool average.

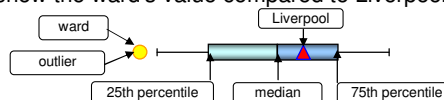
