

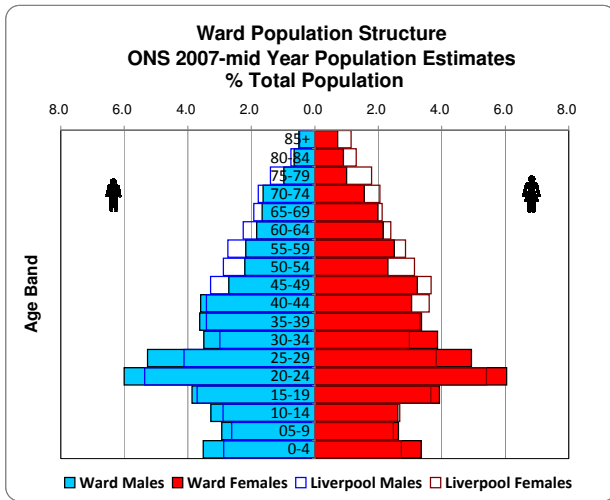
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Princes Park is amongst the most deprived quintile in Liverpool. 60% of its dwellings consist of social housing which is amongst the highest in the city.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than the Liverpool average.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is amongst the highest in Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A\* - C grades is amongst the lowest in the city.

Rates of domestic burglaries and robberies are higher than for Liverpool whilst vehicle crime rates are lower.

According to the 2001 Census, 28% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is higher than for Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are amongst the highest for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

For males and females, Princes Park experiences higher all age mortality than Liverpool due to all causes, all circulatory diseases and all cancers. Premature mortality rates for all causes and cancer are amongst the highest in the city.

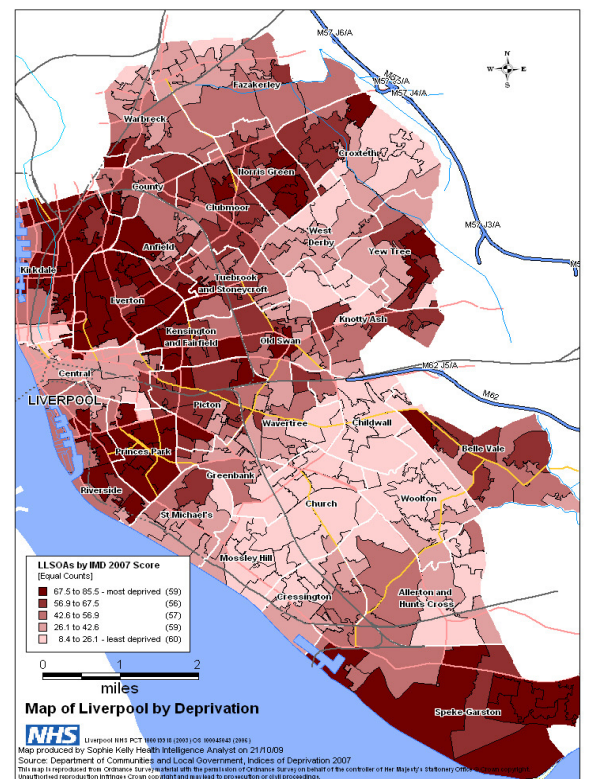
For males and females of all ages, Princes Park's mortality rates for coronary heart disease are higher than the Liverpool average whilst its rates for stroke are amongst the lowest in the city.

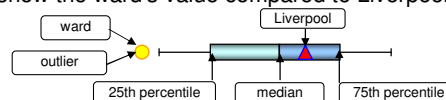
