

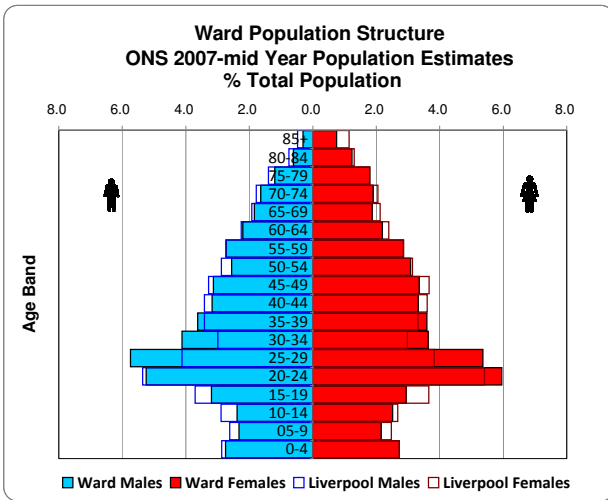
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Riverside is amongst the second most deprived quintile in Liverpool. One third of its dwellings consist of social housing which is above the Liverpool average.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is amongst the lowest in Liverpool.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is higher than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A\* - C grades is lower than the Liverpool average.

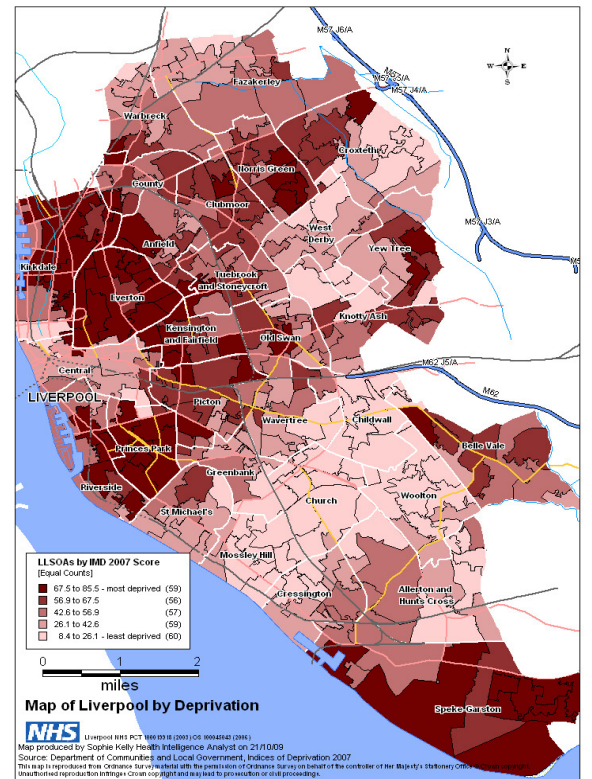
The rate of domestic burglaries is amongst the lowest in Liverpool whilst robberies and vehicle crime rates are amongst the highest.

According to the 2001 Census, 27% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is higher than for Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are higher than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

For males and females, Princes Park experiences higher all age mortality than Liverpool due to all causes, all circulatory diseases and all cancers. This is also the case for premature mortality. All cause and cancer mortality rates are amongst the highest in Liverpool.

For males and females of all ages, Princes Park's mortality rates for stroke are amongst the highest in Liverpool; this is also the case for coronary heart disease in males.

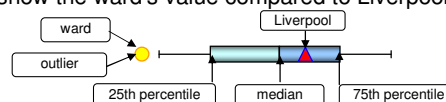
