

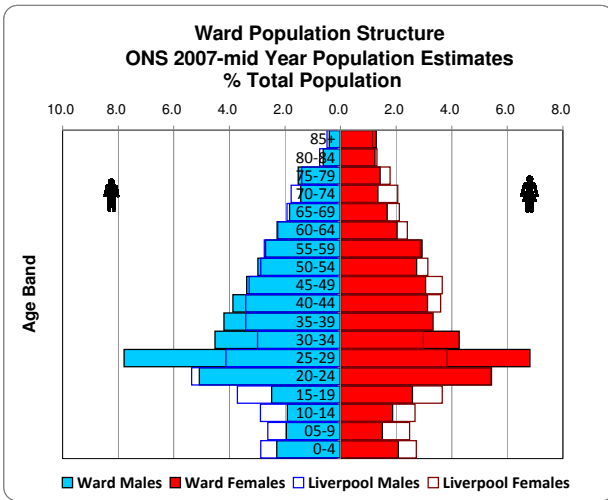
LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

Ward Summary

St Michael's is amongst the second least deprived quintile in Liverpool. 81% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than nationally, although female life expectancy is higher than for Liverpool.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is amongst the lowest in Liverpool.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is comparable to the Liverpool average.

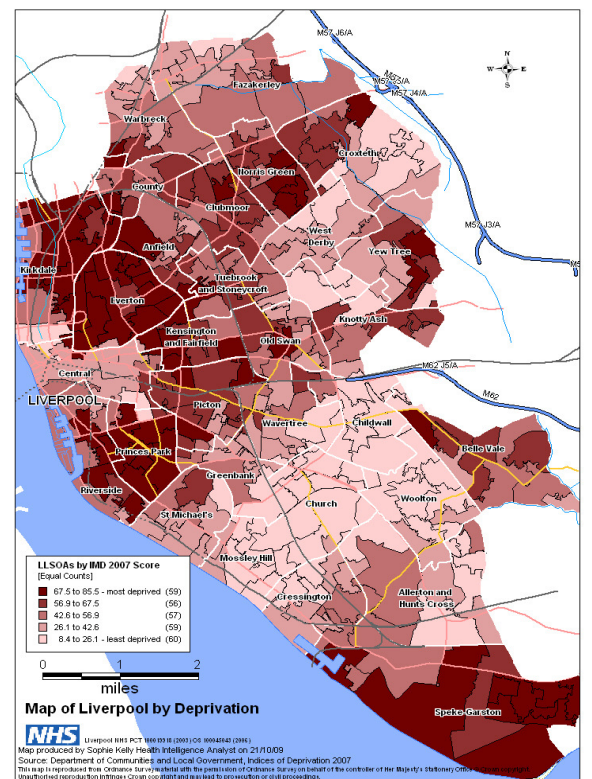
Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are all lower than for Liverpool.

According to the 2001 Census, 23% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is slightly below the Liverpool average.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than for Liverpool as are rates of worklessness.

St Michael's experiences higher all age mortality in males than Liverpool due to all causes, all cancers and all circulatory diseases with the latter amongst the highest in the city. This is also the case for premature mortality apart from cancer.

For persons of all ages, St Michael's rates for coronary heart disease mortality are comparable to the Liverpool average whilst its stroke mortality is amongst the highest in the city.

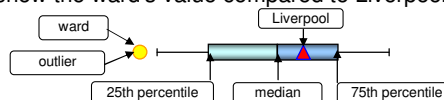
