

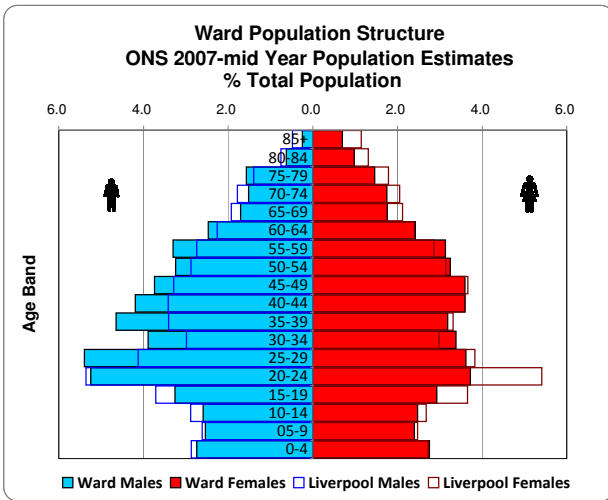
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Warbreck is amongst the third quintile of deprivation in Liverpool. 86% of its dwellings are privately rented or owned which is higher than for Liverpool.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than nationally, life expectancy for females is lower than the Liverpool average.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is higher than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A - C grades is higher than the Liverpool average.

Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are higher than Liverpool as a whole.

According to the 2001 Census, 23% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is lower than the average for Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than the Liverpool average as are rates of worklessness.

Warbreck's all age all cause male mortality rates are lower than the Liverpool average however all age all cause mortality in females is higher. Premature mortality rates are higher than the Liverpool average for females only.

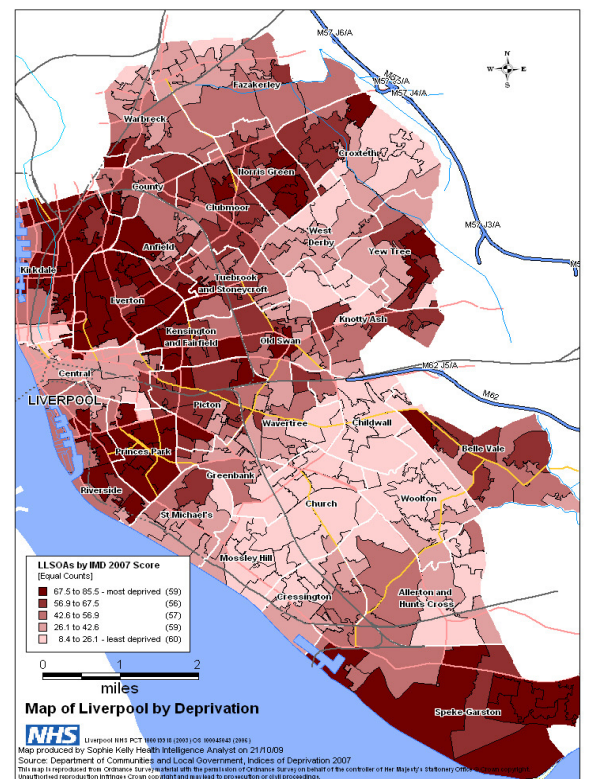
For females of all ages, Warbreck's mortality rates for coronary heart disease mortality are higher than the Liverpool average as are the rates for stroke mortality. Males stroke mortality is also higher than the Liverpool average.

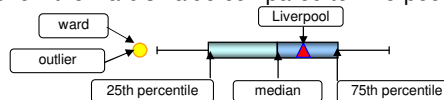
