

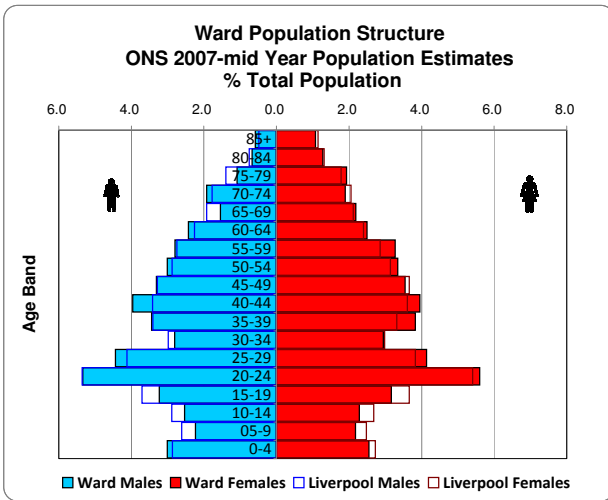
# LIVERPOOL WARD HEALTH PROFILE 2009

### Ward Summary

Wavertree is amongst the second least deprived quintile in Liverpool. 85% of its dwellings are privately owned or rented.

Life expectancy at birth for both males and females is lower than nationally, however life expectancy is higher than the Liverpool average.

The birth rate per 1,000 females aged 15-44 is lower than the Liverpool average.

GCSE attainment i.e. the percentage of students gaining 5 A\* - C grades is higher than the Liverpool average.

Rates of domestic burglaries, robberies and vehicle crime are lower than Liverpool as a whole.

According to the 2001 Census, 21% of residents have a limiting long term illness which is lower than the average for Liverpool.

The proportions of claimants on incapacity benefits and job seekers allowance are lower than the Liverpool average as are rates of worklessness.

Wavertree's all age all cause male mortality rates are lower than the Liverpool average however all age all cause mortality in females is higher. Premature mortality rates are higher than the Liverpool average for females only.

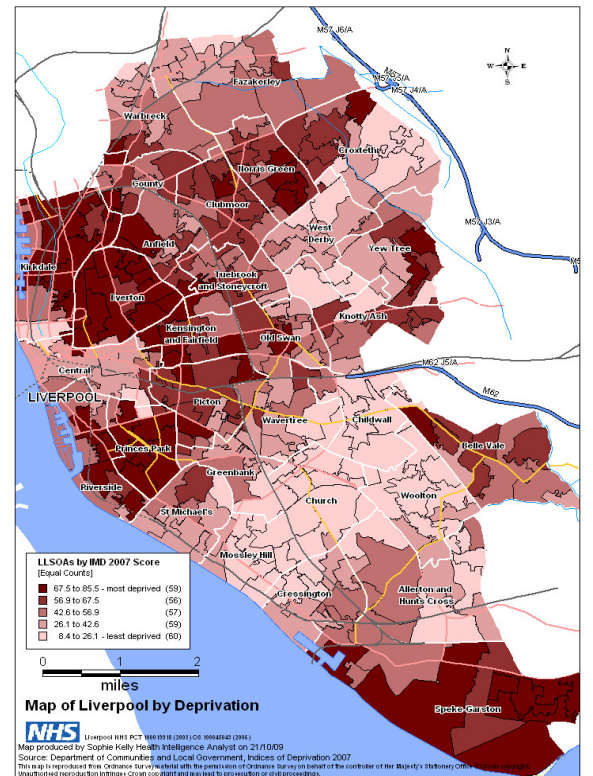
For persons of all ages, Wavertree's mortality rates for coronary heart disease mortality are lower than the Liverpool average as are the rates for stroke mortality. Both male and female stroke mortality is also lower than the Liverpool average.

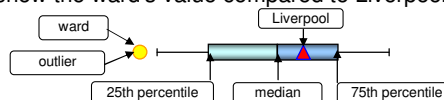
